I. Introduction

Casey's Law is a way to have someone court ordered to substance abuse treatment when they refuse to see their need for help.

If you have a friend or loved one that you believe

- O1 Suffers from a drug or alcohol addiction,
- **O2** Presents an imminent risk of harm to themselves or others, and
- **03** Can benefit from treatment,

a Judge may order them to treatment for up to 360 days. However, since individual liberties are at stake, several steps and court proceedings are required. The entire process may take a week, and will require effort from you, but our Office is here to help.



II. Process

To start Casey's Law, you must file a petition to the District Court of the county in which the respondent resides. In the petition, you must state facts showing the respondent suffers from an addiction and presents a risk of harm. You may be required to testify to these facts but know that the proceedings are CLOSED to the public, and this is a civil not criminal proceeding. After an initial hearing upon the petition, if probable cause exists, the Judge

will order the respondent to be evaluated by a Doctor and Qualified Mental Health Professional. If the evaluations agree that the respondent suffers from an addiction, presents a risk of harm, and can benefit from treatment, the Judge may order them to treatment for up to 360 days. As the petitioner, you will be responsible for finding a treatment center for the respondent and could be responsible for the cost.
